

BYLAW NO. 13-96

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF HUDSON BAY IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN TO REGULATE THE BURNING OF REFUSE WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWN OF HUDSON BAY.

The Council of the Town of Hudson Bay in the Province of Saskatchewan, under the authority of the Saskatchewan Clean Air Act, Section 18, hereby enacts as follows:

Definitions:

- 1) The terms and expressions used in this bylaw shall have the same respective meaning as in Section 2 and 18 of the clean Air Act and Section 11 of the Clean Air Regulations.

Prohibition:

- 2) No person shall cause or permit to be caused the open burning of trash, refuse, garbage, industrial waste or any other material or waste in an open fire or an incinerator in the manner that causes air pollution within the boundaries of the Town of Hudson Bay.

Incinerators:

- 3) No person shall cause or permit to be caused the burning of trash, refuse, garbage, industrial waste or any other waste material in a manner or in an incinerator other than that approved by the Department of Environment and Resource Management.

Exclusions:

- 4) Sections 2 and 3 of this bylaw do not apply to:
 - a) a camp fire or outdoor fireplace used for recreational purposes;
 - b) an outdoor fire using charcoal, processed coal or coke for cooking purposes;
 - c) the burning of brush for the purpose of clearing land for cultivation or for a roadway, railway line pipeline or any other right of way; and
 - d) a fire for the purpose of burning weeds, the prevention or control of fires or the training of persons for fire fighting, if the fire is specifically authorized or required pursuant to any Act, Act of Parliament or bylaw of a municipality.
 - e) The operations of forest industries existing as of the date of this bylaw within the town site of Hudson Bay which include the use of beehive burners or other on site methods of burning wood waste produced as a result of their operations.

Approval from the Council of the Town of Hudson Bay and a burning permit issued by the Fire Chief of the Town of Hudson Bay are required prior to causing a fire for the purposes outlined in sections 4 c) and 4 d). In an emergency situation approval may be obtained from the local fire or police authorities.

Penalties:

- 6) Any person who violates or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this bylaw is guilty of an offense and liable on summary conviction to the penalties set out in The Urban Municipality Act, 1984 or the General Penalty Bylaw of the municipality.


Coming into Force:
