BYLAW NO. 12-03

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF HUDSON BAY TO ESTABLISH A POLICY AND SCHEDULE OF CHARGES FOR RECEIPT OF CERTAIN MATERIALS AT THE TOWN'S WASTE DISPOSAL SITE LOCATED AT SE10-45-3-W2ND

The Mayor and Council of The Town of Hudson Bay, in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

The following policies and fees are hereby adopted respecting receipt of certain materials at the Town's Waste Disposal Site located at SE10-45-3-W2nd.

- 1) Building Demolition Materials Fee:
 - .10¢ per square foot for frame structures
 - \$50.00 per tandem truck load for concrete and other debris
 - \$75.00 per semi truck load for concrete and other debris
- 2) Contaminated Soil Policy and Charges:
 - a) Prior to accepting the soil, the Owner must provide the Town with a soil sample report. The Town will review the report with the Provincial Department presiding over The Environmental Management and Protection Act of Saskatchewan; any costs charged by the Department for this review will be to the owner. After the review with the Department, the Town will decide whether to accept the soil. The Town reserves the right to refuse the soil for any reason and to limit quantities.
 - b) If the Town accepts ownership of the soil, the Owner will pay the Town \$12.00 per cubic yard (\$15.25 per cubic meter) of soil plus GST, for the total amount of soil delivered to the landfill. The Contractor will be responsible for leveling the soil as directed by the Town Foreman or his designate. The Town will isolate the soil to a separate location and cultivate it in accordance with the regulations and guidelines of the Department, until the contamination is reduced to a level acceptable to the Department.
 - c) The Owner will be responsible for any damage to the Town's infrastructure (e.g. sidewalks, curb and gutter, asphalt, water and sewer service, etc.), in removing and replacing the soil on the Owner's property within the Town of Hudson Bay.
 - d) Underground storage tanks will not be accepted.
- 3) This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect upon its date of adoption.
